- · Carried out regular day to day duties.



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



# Insurance Claim - Collapsing Rear Boundary Retaining Wall at New Road Cemetery

I refer to my recent visit and confirm that we have been appointed in respect of your claim by your buildings insurer, Aviva.

As I explained at the time of my visit, it is my opinion that the damage has been caused by gradual deterioration with age rather than any insured contingency. The situation may have been exacerbated by the close proximity of the neighbouring conifer hedge. However this has now been removed and should therefore not give further problems.

Your buildings insurance policy provides cover for damage to your buildings but excludes damage caused by gradual deterioration or frost damage. The subsidence extension to your cover would exclude damage to walls in te absence of damage to the associated building.

Accordingly, I have to advise you that your buildings insurer is unable to offer any further assistance on this occasion.

With regard to any claim you may have against the neighbouring tree owner, this issue can be quite complex. However, in simple terms, your neighbour, as a lay person, would be able to defend any action on the basis that he was ignorant of possible damage due to tree root action. Now that he is aware he has taken reasonable steps to mitigate this nuisance by felling trees alongside the wall.
